

2010-2011 FBA High School Dress Code Guidelines

First Baptist Academy High School bases its dress code upon two criteria: Biblical standards of modesty (I Timothy 2:9, Romans 12:1) and the desire for a neat, clean, and attractive appearance. Students should dress in a way that would not detract from the Academy's mission statement.

FBAHS students are expected to comply with the following guidelines:

- No t-shirts, sleeveless shirts, tank tops, spaghetti straps, off the shoulder blouses, backless shirts or sheer material.
- Tops must not be lower than 3" below the collar bone. Shirts must hang below the top of pants. Back, midriff, and underwear must not be exposed at any time.
- Boys must wear a collared shirt.
- Both boys and girls shirts may have no writing or graphics with the exception of a small brand logo.
- All skirts/shorts/dresses must be no shorter than 3" above the knee.
- Jeans & shorts are permitted to be worn everyday with the exception of chapel day (Thursday). Belt line must be at the waistline.
- No athletic shorts or athletic pants.
- Hats & hoods are not permitted at any time.
- Sweaters & jackets may be worn, but must depict appropriate messages; things that honor and glorify God.
- Flip-flops are permitted everyday. No flip-flops with plugs or bedroom slippers.
- All clothing must be in good repair (no holes or rips) and may not fit too tight or too loose.

Dress Down Days: Athletic pants and athletic shorts are allowed to be worn as well as t-shirts. *Please ensure that t-shirts have no inappropriate messages (i.e. no explicit writing, no questionable issues, no bands not glorifying God, etc.)*

Standards for ALL FBAHS students:

- Clothing must be modest at all times while on campus and at school events held off campus.
- Hairstyles with extreme cuts or unnatural colors must be avoided.
- No body piercing except for a girl's earrings are allowed to be worn on campus.
- Tattoos are not permitted.

Parents may be called and asked to bring the student appropriate dress, or to pick up student when he/she has not complied with the above guidelines. Violations may result in a detention.
